Orford, New Hampshire

Physical Difficulty: Easy

Special Features: Natural

Walking Conditions: Pavement, Trail

Duration: 0:25

Bring: Canoe, Pencil, Swimsuit

To get there: Take Rte. 10 south from the Orford/Fairlee bridge and pass 25A on the left. Park in the firehouse lot on the left just past 25A. The boat landing is across the street.

Clues:

Park your car near the Orford firehouse,
But don't block the way of the fire trucks.
Bring a writing tool – that's cool.

Go to the street, but don't cross yet.
Look for the first letter on the speed limit sign: _____
Now cross the street and don't watch your feet.

Look for a sign off to the right
What is the state it is defending?
Find the 2nd letter of the state abbreviation. _____

Go to the sign that says "Boat Landing Road".
Look at the 2nd word and find the 4th letter: _____
Start to walk down Boat Landing Road.

Look to the right at a yellow house.
It is very old -- 1799.
Don't look for a letter. That's better.

Keep going. No left turning.
You've had a long walk.
Now rest and talk.

Take the first letter of this town's name: _____
Walk ahead to the little brown shed,
But don't bump your head.

On the "Boating Access" sign, in the third line,
What is the 3rd letter after the 6? _____
On the same sign after 11,
What is the 1st letter of the 2nd word? _____

Find the "STOP" sign.
What is the third letter of the second descriptor word for these special
plants? _____

Talk a walk toward the water.
Look at the gray stuff on the bank on the left
What is the 1st letter of the word of what covers the bank? _____

Find the sign on the posts with the letters of red. What is the 3rd to last
letter in the longest word? _____

You have all the letters. You can unscramble them now. Here's a clue.
It's a compound word that starts with B and ends with E.

Look to the right at just your height. And there it will be -- in a tree.
