Walking Conditions: Pavement


Duration: 0:45

To get there: Follow Route 4 west to Woodstock. This Quest begins in the center of the Woodstock Village Green.

Clues:

1. Start at the (X) go south through the white gate, keep walking to the eagle and don't wait, this is where the ladies ate.
2. Leave the eagle and go west to the steeple, now walk down the street that is sometimes illegal.
3. See the church and cross the street, there are four pillars that look really neat. Walk west but do not rest and do your best to find the sign (built 1823) because this is where they got their medical degrees.
4. Cross the street, dead end is your key, walk a bit further, a big rosette you will see.
5. Go across the bridge with the green railing, keep on walking and don't think you are failing. Look for a place with 2 pools and lots of sun, it used to be a mill that was not as much fun.
6. Now carefully, please—cross the street and skip to the place where the elderly meet.

7. Head back east and go to a road called River Street.
It used to have two horse tracks at the very least.



8. Continue on until you see a place where dead people will always be,
and this is where they would be but they end up in NYC.

9. Reverse your direction and head back west,
look for a conical roof that will put you to the test.

10. Look toward the mountain on a green-plated sign,
walk north and follow the telephone lines.

11. Keep on walking until you see a big porch full of white pillars
where they used to drink tea.

12. Now across the street you will see a cupola
and that was where the horse and carriage used to be.

13. Follow the stone wall and meet the stone plaque, keep on walking, you're on the right track. Turn to your right, what do you see, a place where the Girl Scouts used to be.

14. Head on west until you see an (X) now you're ready for your final Quest. Look for five trees and one tree in the middle for that is where you will find something little.

15. Now you deserve to sit and observe this beautiful place that has been preserved.
