To get there: This Quest starts at Colburn Park, the park on the downtown Lebanon Green about 5 miles south of Hanover on Rte. 120. Italics tells you where to go; the plain text teaches all about lovely Lebanon.

Clues:

Take a tour of Lebanon's architectural scenes
With just a short walk from the Lebanon Green.
Start at the spitting cherub, center of the green
Head southwest, this first building can be seen!

1. Old white paint covers my walls,
I have green shutters thin and tall.
I am an old and simple shrine,
A fish adorns this roof of mine.
My 12 over 12 windows are simple and few,
Four columns in front will welcome you.
Near my top, four goblets made of stone,
Sit by the bell—all on their own.
Head back to the fountain and see if you can find
This building, it is one of a kind.

2. I have arched doors and 20 over 20 windows,
And a big flag that moves when the wind blows.
On my top is a silver dome
and a clock that tells you what time to go home.
Two doors down to the right
Check this place out, it is quite a sight!

3. I've got weapons on my roof, cannonballs on my lawn,
I celebrate memories of soldiers who are gone.
A Roman Arch on my porch, words in my wall,
A soldier in front who stands proud and tall.
Stroll around the green to the right and look
This lovely place has more than one book!

4. Corinthian columns you will see.
V for a U, could it be?
A rainy day with nothing to do:
Somewhere in here, there's something for you.
Cross the street at the cross walk marking
Pass by the Post Office, keep on walking.

5. I have a pointed roof with a cross on top,
in my shutters is a bell that goes Bing, Bong!

Cross the street carefully and have a look for me.
The curbs are steep, so watch your feet.
