### **Cornish, New Hampshire**

*To get there: From the New Hampshire side of the Cornish Windsor Covered Bridge, travel south on 12A past Town House Road. Stay south on 12A. The church is on the left as you climb up the hill, approximately ½ mile south of the bridge.*

### **Clues:**

Park your car

Don't go far.

Head for the stones,

Look out!

There are some bones

Below you.

Trinity Cemetery is where you'll be.

An obelisk stone is what you'll see.

It is real tall,

Old Israel Hall.

Count five rows back and please don't slack.

Look to your right,

A flat stone's in sight.

A big eye can be found

Just above ground.

You should be in the place

Where Jonathan Chase

lies underground

Six feet down.

A key, a cross  
of skull and bones  
These are the things  
That Jonathan now owns.

Go back to the Church  
Toward Mount Ascutney
